Hello Sir Knights! I hope everyone had an amazing Holidays season. Now it is time to buckle down and get to work. We have our inspection this month on Saturday the 23rd. Please let all Sir Knights know so that we can have a great turn out and really impress our candidate. We will also be doing the Red Cross Degree and Malta Degree prior to the inspection date.

New Business: The recorder explained that the Commandery was under the impression that the Grand Commandery per capita increase, from \$3.10 to \$10.00 was supposedly to take place next year. We recently found out that the increase is **THIS** year. To this end, we are proposing and dues increase of \$6.90 plus an additional \$2.10 to amortize over the next three plus years to cover this increase the Commandery will foot this year. The motion was made in the form of an amendment, which was approved by Sir Knight Wiley and seconded by Sir Knight Haines. The motion passed a copy of which is attached below.

IE: We were previously paying \$12.10 / \$25.00 to Grand Commandery and Grand Encampment. Last year we paid \$19.00 / \$31.90 to Grand Commandery and Grand Encampment with no increase in dues so, Canton Commandery

covered the \$6.90 per member increase. This will now increase the dues to \$34.00 per year to cover the increased per capita and amortize the amount Commandery covered for each members this year.

No vote is necessary since our bylaws allow us to automatically increase dues to match increased per capita taxes. This motion is merely at
