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

They make brands like Ray-Ban and Oakley, with 6,000 retail shops like Sunglass Hut and Lens Crafters. His estimated net worth is now above \$10 billion dollars.

Similar to Vecchio, here is another story of a man who at age 5 lost his Father. At age 17 he had already lost four jobs and got married at age 18. He joined the army and washed out there. At age 20 his wife left him and took their baby. At age 65 he retired and felt like a failure and decided to commit suicide. While sitting under a tree, trying to write a will, he ended up writing what he could have accomplished with his life. There was one thing he could do better than anyone he knew, and that was how to cook. So he borrowed \$87.00, bought

and fried up some chicken using his own recipe. He went door to door selling this to his neighbors in Kentucky. Eventually his recipe took off and at age 88, he had built an empire and had become a billionaire.



Brief Historic Story of Nazir Grotto Chartered: June 29, 1921

Nazir "The Red Carpet Grotto" contributing to the social life of Canton Masons. Its friendly spirit emphasizes its great principle of good fellowship.

Yusef Kahn Grotto of Akron, Ohio launched Nazir Grotto with a friendly push sowing the first seeds on November 5, 1920 at a meeting with a motion that Bro. Herman DeVol make application for a dispensation to establish a Grotto in Canton. Three names were proposed. Nazir, Selim, and Samoor with Nazir being adopted.

Frederick P. Walthers of Cleveland, acting representative of Grand Monarch, Dwight E. Cone, delivered the Dispensation to Canton on November 20, 1920. Yusef Kahn, as parent Grotto, installed Charles Stolberg, Monarch; Henry R. Bauhof, Treasurer and Herman F. DeVol, Secretary. By-laws were adopted on April 2, 1921. June 29. 1921, a Charter was granted to Nazir Grotto. Membership increased rapidly to **over three thousand strong**. Nazir was recognized as one of the outstanding Grottoes in the Realm by 1942.



Politically Correct Food Chain




