



Brother Herm Gillette Has Centennial

Earl Blazer, Jim Lewers, Paul Feaser, and Gary Dressler from Canton Lodge 60 visited Bro. Herm Gillette on the day of his 100th birthday, March 23, 2018. Bro. Gillette was raised on June 15, 1949 in Canton Lodge 60. It was amazing the memory of a rather spry Herm had. If we recall correctly, he said he coached 5 Brethren who went on to be Worshipful Masters of the

lodge. After we had birthday cupcakes, he took us into his bedroom (he lives with his daughter and son-in-law) and showed us a display of Masonic and WW II items. He was a tail gunner in a B-17 during the Second World War. Later he worked as a security guard and fireman for the Timken Company until retirement. He recalled a story about one evening, while on duty at the Timken Company, an inebriated man causing trouble outside the plant and Herm asked him to stop and move on. The man pulled a gun and shot at Bro. Gillette putting a hole in his hat grazing the side of his head. Bro. Gillette fired back and hit the man in the cheek. Canton PD got there and arrested the man in good time. In this season of Centennials and celebration of years of Masonic brotherhood, the four of us had a great afternoon with this fine old gentleman and have hopes for many more birthdays with him.
