

Hello Companions! Welcome to another year of Cryptic masonry.

Most of you that read this are already aware of how important Council is to completing the store of Freemasonry. Many people that are not members of a council may not know. To that end I am including a excerpt from the Grand Councils web site: One Cryptic Masonry's popularity is that it completes a story, a Masonic allegory. Freemasonry is very philosophical and teaches its ideals by allegory or story. This philosophy is moralistic and religious however Freemasonry is not a religion, nor a substitute for one. A requirement for membership in Freemasonry is a professed belief in God and eternal life. It is mandatory that a man profess a personal faith in a Supreme Being prior to becoming a Freemason. Freemasonry never attempts to alter any ones beliefs. Freemasonry offers no theology or plan of salvation. However, it does offer a moral plan to use in this world; leaving the Mason to look to his religion for salvation into the next world. Ancient Cryptic Masonry centers around the story of the preservation, loss and recovery of the Word. The Word represents mans search for life's purpose and the nature of GOD. Symbolic Freemasonry, as in the Lodge, teaches of the loss of the Word and hope for its recovery. Royal Arch Masonry, as in the Chapter, teaches its recovery. Cryptic Masonry, as in the Council, completes this story by teaching of the Words initial preservation.



New Grand Master Installed



Most Wor. Bro. Thomas D. Zahler, Grand Master of Masons of Ohio

During impressive Grand Lodge cer-emonies on Oct. 16, 1993, Thomas D. Zahler of Can-ton, Ohio was installed as Grand Master of Masons of Ohio. Most Wor. Bro. Zahler was raised a Master Ma-son on Nov. 21, 1966 in Clinton Lodge No. 47, F. & AM. Of Massillon and served as Worshipful Master of that lodge in 1971--72. He served as District Deputy Grand Master of the 21st Masonic District in 1976-78. He is affiliated with all York Rite Bod-ies: Hiram Chapter No. 18; Massillon Commandery No.4, and Canton Council No. 35, R. & S.M.

Grand Master Zahler is a past Worthy

Patron of Hadassah Chapter No. 108, O.E.S., past Commander-in-Chief of Stark Consistory, AAS.R., Valley of Canton and was coroneted a thirty-third degree Mason in Boston, on September 26, 1984.

He was appointed Grand Chaplain of the Grand Lodge of Ohio on October 13, 1984, became Junior Grand Deacon in 1986 and subsequently appointed Senior Grand Deacon in 1987, Grand Marshal in 1988 and Grand Orator in 1989; then elected Junior Grand Warden in 1990, Senior Grand Warden in 1991 and Deputy Grand Master in 1992.

Canton Masonic Temple 1926 By: Robert R. Martelet M.S.A.

This picture of the Canton Masonic Temple surfaced during the summer months of 2018 and brings a host of memories to mind. This picture is unusual because it was taker south of the building on Market Avenue showing the south side of the structure. The reader will note both drives in position, the north side drive entering and the southern exiting from the rear parking facilities which where built in the early 20's. As noted in an earlier article, the city moved Ninth Street many years after this picture was taken. Looking closely one can see the red brick two story home to the North of the Temple which was raised in the 40's or 50's. A one story office building was erected on the site and later moved to the northwest corner of Ninth Street and Walnut Avenue. Also the reader will note, looking at the picture, the south side of the Masonic Temple building is

not like the existing building today. The freight elevator extension at the rear was erected some years later on the southeast corner outside of the main building. Probably for this reason the second internal elevator was never installed in its prebuilt enclosure located on the east side of the lobby where a water fountain stands today. As we work in and inhabit this fine old structure, we do not realize the changes that have accrued over the years and tend to take for granted that things are as they were years ago. The parking facilities for example were somewhat small compared to today's standards. Automobiles were one to a family and not all families owned one. Public transportation was the thing in the 20's until the 60's. Bus and street car routs were plentiful and ran every 10 to 15 minutes at a cost of .05 to .10 cents with a transfer. The public square was awash with city bus and street car traffic most of the day as a transfer point to all parts of the city. In later years the Temple Committee purchased the aging houses along the west side of Walnut Avenue, had them raised and built the existing parking facilities. And yes! I have seen this large parking lot full to capacity many times with many visitors forced to park across Market Avenue at the funeral home which is now closed, out of business and gone. Time marches on and things change and are forgotten. Many Brethren do not realize or remember when originally built, the Masonic Temple was cooled in the summer months with cold water. That's right! An early form of air conditioning! Water was pumped from one of the two large wells located under the building through the heating system and than drained back into the ground by the aid of the second well. When city water was instituted, the wells were sealed and that ended the cooling process as designed into the original structure. The sky-light located at the top of the main stair-well was a real focal point of the building. Stained glass for sun light to project through. It was beautiful during the day and early evening. But in the 90's when energy prices skyrocketed, it had to be covered to keep the heat from escaping through to glass ceiling. Remember in the 40's, coal used for heating, was only about \$10.00 to \$12.00 a ton delivered. \$500.00 went a long way! Even the trees on the front lawn were removed several times over the years. We've gone from that ragged looking Elm to Maples and than to Blue Spruce back to Hard Maples and than to what we have now. And when the wind bent the flag pole located on the highest point of the Temple, where Old Glory flew in all its majestic power, had to be removed and installed on the front lawn, it was a Canton icon gone. Many looked to it for wind direction and speed as it towered over the city. Oh! I could go on for hundreds more words writing about what you and I remember. And like the Masonic Bulletin celebrating 100 years of publication, the Canton Masonic Temple is nearing its centennial and is for all appearance still a worthy statue representing a better life through Masonry still standing tall on the corner of Ninth Street and North Market Avenue. So-mot-it-be.

Littlefield, Grand Historian of the Grand Lodge of Connecticut, reported on his research: Two Presidents have held the Office of Grand Master of the Grand Lodges - Andrew Jackson of Tennessee and Harry S. Truman of Missouri. Two Presidents served as District Deputy Grand Masters; James Buchanan of Pennsylvania & Truman. Four were Worshipful Masters of their Lodges; George Washington of Virginia, Jackson, Buchanan and Truman. Besides those who presided over their Lodges, two others served in their lodge in the Officer LInes; James Garfield of Ohio and James K. Polk of Tennessee and North Carolina. Eight U.S. Presidents were Royal Arch

and I lost most of my food. The Tuscarawas River water level was extremely low and the boat dragged almost the whole first day; not getting to camp until about 9:00 o'clock. After paddling and portaging 30 miles, we sat up camp in Newcomerstown, demoralized wondering if we would complete the trip.

Day four was a cloudless day with strong headwinds and no current. Reaching our last lock before Stockport we met a very nice family with a pontoon boat. Feeling demoralized from the very slow current and the strong headwind; we asked the nice family with the pontoon boat for a tow. Agreeing they towed us from a little north of Stockport where we pulled off the river and they asked if we wanted to stay there for the night. Luckily they had an extra cabin aborad with beds and yes, we were very fortunate.

Setting off in the morning the family then towed us the rest of the way to Stockport Lock. We made quick work of the trip from Stockport Lock to Lowell; setting up camp underneath a bridge and feeling like true vagrants.

The last day was bittersweet as we knew our trip was coming to an end. That morning we were met with coffee and donuts from our Deputy Grand Master Jess Raines. He said we might see him for a portion of the trip next year! We stopped into the Edgewater Tavern in Marietta for a burger and maybe a few too many well deserved beers. We made one more portage around the last lock and finally arrived at our destination, Williamstown, West Virginia.

All in all it was a great trip! I've made new friends and strengthened friendships. I'm glad that I was able to go on this adventure and represent Canton Lodge amd Masonry on this amazing journey.
