



In ancient times the Entered Apprentice Degree was alone prevalent amongst the generality of our Lodges; for no Brothers could be passed and raised except

in the Grand Lodge, and few availed themselves of the privilege. Hence they had only one sign, one token, and one word, and these three constituted the honors. But the members of the Grand Lodge had three signs, three tokens, and three words and therefore, "three times three" were appropriately termed the "Grand Honors." Now you know!


Below is a short excerpt I found in regards to Cryptic Masonry. I hope you find it as interesting as I did.

The Council of Royal and Select Masters is referred to as Cryptic Masonry and takes its name from the word Crypt having its origins in the Greek language meaning a concealed place or subterranean vault. Indeed the degrees of Royal Master and Select Master deal with the vault under the Temple of Solomon. Originally these degrees were placed between the Craft Lodge and the Chapter Degrees and the stories contained are like a bridge connecting the two branches. The Super Excellent Master Degree, while conferred by the Council of Royal and Select Masters, is not truly a Cryptic Degree, as it does not pertain to the crypt or vault.

Sadly the Cryptic Rite of Freemasonry is often overlooked by many Masons on their way to the Chivalric Degrees as it is not a prerequisite for admission.

The Mason who misses this Masonic Degree misses a great deal for these degrees conferred in dramatic representations are rich with Masonic history and instruction.



June 2, 2019, Daughters of Mokanna Celebrates 100 Years

Truth, justice, equality and brotherly love, formed a new Order embracing the ideals of happiness, in 1889, in Hamilton, New York. A group of Masons, whose fundamentals of character are honesty, social enjoyment, understanding, sympathy, and good fellowship and thus, the Grotto was formed.

In 1919, several Prophets and their wives wished to form a woman's organization with the same principles. Grand Secretary Otto Hilderbrandt, Past Monarch of Rock Island, Illinois, along with Robert Rexdale, also of Amoo Grotto, and Carl Lundberg of Zal Grotto, Moline, Illinois, met with our organizer,

Josephine Mace, who became our first Supreme Mighty Chosen One. It was their support that allowed Mrs. Mace's dream to flourish, and The Daughters of Mokanna was born on **June 5**, 1919.

The four original subordinate Daughters of Mokanna Chapters that opened in their respective communities were: No. 1, Amoo - Rock Island, Illinois; No. 2, Mohassan - Davenport, Iowa; No. 3, Ankara - Kansas City, Missouri and No. 4, Zal - Moline, Illinois. Together, these four subordinate chapters formed the Supreme Daughters of Mokanna. Through the years, the Order has spread to 20 additional states and into Canada.

Nazir Daughters of Mokanna No. 27 was organized in 1923 in Canton, Ohio by Laura Milner. Her foresight and untiring effort in organizing the Nazir Chapter brought to the women of this community a wealth of good fellowship and a desire to put into action our better impulses toward culture and refinement. The first organizational meeting was held at the Canton Masonic Temple on November 2, 1923 at 7:30 pm in the Commandery Room (W.T.Grant Building) with Nazir Grotto's Monarch, Joseph Frank presiding. Upon hearing the report that 57 petitioners were ready to join, Monarch Frank called for an election of temporary officers. Laura Milner was nominated and elected temporary chairman. Mrs. Milner appointed a committee to secure a meeting place and a committee to plan a banquet for the night of the Institution. The next meeting was held on November 18, 1923 for the purpose of the election officers where Mrs. Laura Milner, was elected Mighty Chosen One. The Installation of Nazir No. 27 officers was held on December 20, 1923 with

145 of the 185 ladies that signed the original Charter present to assume the obligation. PSMCO Esther Hogan of Moline, Illinois presided over the Installation of Officers and Nazir No. 27 was now a Chapter.

The aim of the Daughters of Mokanna is to bring into closer relationship the families of Grotto members and to promote Sociability, Friendship, Charity, Education and Patriotism. The purpose of the Order is to assist and cooperate with the local Grotto in every way possible. We endeavor to make our Ceremonials full of fun to help us to forget the worries of everyday life. Above all, we strive for cheerful good fellowship and to aid and comfort one another. Our objectives are both social and philanthropic. Our major humanitarian work is supporting the Enchanted Lantern program through the Supreme Council M.O.V.P.E.R. Humanitarian Foundation. Additionally, we offer assistance to numerous local charities and organizations in our communities. Our members volunteer at the VA, local schools, churches, hospice, and hospitals. We continue to donate, as the Daughters before us, to the Battered Women's Shelter, the Serving Area Military Center, the Humanitarian Foundation, and most recently we donated a scooter to our local VFW. We have sung Christmas Carols at nursing homes where our Daughters have resided. Daughters joining together and making a difference in the lives of others is, and shall always remain, our mission.

Over the past 96 years, Nazir No. 27 has been the proud home of 7 Supreme Mighty Chosen Ones: Grace Clarke 1936 and 1937; Elizabeth Ring 1956; Heidi Beck 1972; Beverly Moore 1991; Ruby Kalkman 2001; Lora Givler 2008 and Cynthia Gay 2017. Nazir No. 27 has installed 97 Mighty Chosen Ones since its institution. We are blessed to have the following still with us: Valerie Miller 1976, Ruby Kalkman 1981, Lenora Walter 1982, Carol Jones 1984, Virginia Weiford 1985, Joan Ann Walter 1986, Lora Givler 1991, Kathy George 1992, Cynthia Gay 2003, Barbara Turner 2007, Donna Sparling 2008, Katherine Oesch 2010, Jennifer Arnold 2012, Dorothy Ballard 2014, Judy Wayt 2015 and Sharon Snowden 2019. May it be noted that many of these Daughters have served 2 or 3 times as Mighty Chosen One.

Although the Daughters of Mokanna was originally founded for female relatives of Grotto members, time and society has allowed us to seek members who are related to a Master Mason. Ladies who are currently members of other organizations recognized by the Masonic fraternity are also eligible for membership. Nazir No. 27 meets at Nazir Grotto Hall on 6th Street S.W. at 7:30 p.m. the first Tuesday of every month except January and February.


