How lodge Members Register Their Account in Grand View

Lodge members can update their own personal information, such as their mailing address, telephone or email address. You are encour-aged to do this by creating your own "Grand View Account." Here are the steps to register as a Grand View User:

- With computer turned on and logged onto the internet.
- Access the Grand View system at https://.oh.grandview.system
- Upper right corner of the screen, click-on: "Member Portal" When you land on the Member Portal page, in the right corner are two selections: "Signon" and "Member Registration". To create or register your account, select "Member Registration". (Note: You will se-lect "Sign-on" for your subsequent, periodic Grand View access.)

The Membership Registration screen should now appear. Fill-in the requested information: lodge Number: **Do not enter leading zeros**. Example: If your Lodge Number is 4, just enter the number 4 and not 004, etc. Member ID: Enter your current mem-ber number from your dues card. **Do not enter the letter "M" or leading zeros.** If your dues card indicates M001234, just enter 1234. Last Name: **Enter your last name exactly as it appears on your dues card**. When finished, "Click-on" the Membership Status button. A second page will be displayed. Now enter your email address and a minimum 8 -character password. (**Remember your password as only you will access it as is.**) "Clickon submit" to enter your infor-mation.

You're now a registered user of "Grand View!" Check out your personal information if changes accrue and edit for correctness.
