Brethren All,

Effectively immediately, I declare all Lodge activities, including but not limited to Stated Meetings, Annual Inspections, Ceremonies, Grand Master Receptions, the Grand Masters Class event and Special Meetings of all Ohio Lodges holding allegiance under the Grand Lodge of Free and Accepted Masons of Ohio to be CANCELLED through May 10, 2020. The following directives will support continued business during this period where meetings are restricted:

All usual and customary bills for utilities, taxes, and services acted upon by the Lodge can be approved with consent of the Worshipful Master, Senior Warden, Junior Warden, Secretary and Treasurer during this period. Phone or email are acceptable modes of communication and should be recorded by the Secretary. No Lodge will be disciplined for not meeting the minimum required meetings according to our Code this Masonic year due to this national pandemic.

“Step Into The Light” Brethren. I suggest you use your time now to promote and care for each other. Call your Lodge brethren and widows to lend a hand. Even if we are not able to visit with each other, we can drop off any needed groceries or prescriptions where needed. The time is now more than ever to live our tenets of Brotherly Love, Relief and Truth.

This letter applies to all Masonic lodges, their craft clubs, committees, Temple Companies, social events, and district associations. These guidelines and directives apply to all Ohio Masons including appendent Ohio Masonic orders.

We will continue to provide regular updates to these guidelines as changes develop. Meetings and events will be rescheduled at a future time.

Over the past several years, I have written many articles on the sagging attendance at the meetings of our lodges. Indeed, this is a trend that all organizations are experiencing rather social, religious or fraternal. It appears to me there are more people living in this world today than 40 years ago so, there should be by sheer logistics, more people becoming members than in the past. This does not appear to be the trend and it's also not possible to embarrass, threaten or put a guilt trip on those who choose apathy over attendance. All organizations are failing because the Millennials are just not joiners like their parents were, especially their Fathers. That fact alone does not account for all the empty seats in most lodge rooms. There are a lot of seniors who could attend lodge if comfortable there. It is reported that the memberships average age is over 65 years. Well, and this is food for the younger members, I'm there and can attest for some mental and physical functional changes in the mind and body as we all grow older. Memory fades but most elderly can remember the past more vividly than yesterday breakfast. Patience increases and we are more tolerant of youth and their senseless indifference and mindless mistakes. Mobility is sometimes a challenge so slowness becomes the norm. Finances are

usually not that difficult because we wisely planned for this time of life. Eye sight is sometimes a real challenge, as depth perception and peripheral vision seem to dwindle; and remember, the elderly must face these challenges day by day alone without any book of instructions as a guide; and yes sometimes it becomes a real challenge to adapt. Now, skipping over the amazing fact the seating in most Blue Lodge Rooms were never designed for today’s 21 century human bodies and are somewhat uncomfortable; one other of the elderly functions, which I have chosen to mention last, is their ability to hear clearly. Many of the older brethren worked in large open noisy factory facilities during their lives with no hearing protection and have suffered some hearing loss. Some! Way more than others! Over the last few years, I have witnessed many programs and examination obligations delivered in lodge which may have been very well executed and which I was unable to appreciate because the presenters poor presentation, mumbling, not speaking clearly nor loud enough for the entire lodge to hear; and I’m not the only member to observe this situation. Others have remarked to me and others about this very same dilemma even going so far as to expound: “looks like this fellow is afraid some one will hear him! Boy! It takes more than that to become an officer.” Is it possible that many an older brethren shun lodge meetings because they are not sure of what’s going on but are still asked to vote on something they did not fully hear or understand? Masonry will always adapt itself to changing trends in society. **Even this 101 year old Masonic Bulletin has obliged by raised its print font level a full point, thereby decreasing the amount of information within, but making it easier for the brethren to read.** My point is, this is a real problem and we are all guilty and it’s needs to be addressed. No Officer or Brethren, even Grand Lodge Officers, is immune to its effects. I suggest if you have something to say, say it loud enough that it is not a secret from half the lodge room. Even the P.A. system is of little use if the speaker mumbles into the microphone when used. Ask if everyone can hear and please stop confusing and embarrassing those who have this problem but are polite enough to not stand and ask for those speaking to talk louder or clarify their statement.

Think what you will about this “tell it like it is” article but remember; many an older Brother has donated many years and many dollars to this fraternity in hopes of preserving a place where our future generations have a facility to enjoy and appreciate as we have; only to be shutout of lodge business because of natural hearing difficulties. Witnessing empty seats and sloppy du-guards and signs is enough for the 50 year member to endure. Public speaking failures should not be part of his folly! And yes! I’m sorry to say, **this at long last needed to be said!**

The Lost Symbol” and the Freemasons: 8 Myths Decoded

Novelist Dan Brown’s new book, *The Lost Symbol*, is doing for the Freemasons what its predecessor, *The Da Vinci Code*, did for the Catholic Church’s “Opus Dei” showering new fame and new fictions, on a brotherhood that’s already catnip for conspiracy theories.

No Gospel in Dan Brown’s *Da Vinci Code* Claims, Scholars Say!

Since long before *The Lost Symbol*, Freemasons have been accused of everything from conspiring with extraterrestrials to practicing sexual deviancy to engaging in occult rituals to running the world, or trying to end it. Detractors include global conspiracy theorists and religious organizations, including the Catholic Church.

The Lost Symbol isn’t likely to squelch any rumors, beginning as it does with a wine-filled skull, bejeweled power brokers, and a dark Masonic Temple steps away from the White House.

But what if Freemasons, the world’s largest international secret society, are just a bunch of guys into socializing, non-satanic rituals, self-improvement and community service?

To separate Freemason fact from *Lost Symbol*-style myth, National Geographic News went inside the centuries-old order with two Masons and a historian of the ancient Christian order from which some claim the Masons sprang in the 17th or 18th century.

FREEMASON MYTH No. 1

Masonic Symbols Are Everywhere! It’s true that Masonic symbols are anything but lost, said Freemason and historian Jay Kinney, author of the newly released *Masonic Myth*. Freemasonry is rich in symbols, and many are ubiquitous. Think of the pentagram, or five-pointed star, or the “all-seeing eye” in the Great Seal of the United States. But most Masonic symbols aren’t unique to Freemasonry, Kinney said. “I view the Masonic use of symbols as a grab bag taken from here, there, and everywhere,” he said. “Masonry employs them in its own fashion.” The pentagram, for example, is much older than Freemasonry and acquired its occult overtones only in the 19th and 20th centuries, hundreds of years after the Masons had adopted the symbol. Likewise, the all-seeing eye saw its way to the Great Seal, and the U.S. dollar bill by way of artist Pierre Du Simitiere, a non-Mason. The eye represents divine guidance of the U.S. ship of state, or as Secretary of the U.S. Congress Charles Thompson put it in 1782, it alludes “to the many signal interpositions of providence in favor of the American cause.” There was one known Mason on the committee to design the seal, Benjamin Franklin. His proposed design was eyeless, and rejected.

FREEMASON MYTH No. 2

Masons Descend From the Knights Templar! Much has been made of the Freemasons purported lineage to the Knights Templar. The powerful military and religious order was established to protect medieval pilgrims to the Holy

Land and dissolved by Pope Clement V, under pressure of King Phillip IV of France, in 1312. After modern Masonry appeared in the 17th or 18th century Britain, some Freemasons claimed to have acquired the secrets of the Templars and adopted Templar symbols and terminology. For example: naming certain levels of Masonic hierarchy after Templar degrees. “But those [Knights Templar] degrees and Masonic orders had no historic connection with the original Knights Templar,” Kinney explained. “These are myths or symbolic figures that were used by the Masons. But because the association had been made with these degrees, and the degrees had perpetuated themselves, after a time it began to look like there had been a connection.” Helen Nicholson, author of *The Knights Templar: A New History*, agrees that there is no possibility that Freemasons are somehow descended from the Knights Templar. By the time of the first Masons, the Cardiff University historian said, “there were no more Templars.”

FREEMASON MYTH No. 3

Masons Are Hiding Templar Treasure! One of the Templar-Mason theory’s many veins suggests that some Templars survived the order’s 14th century destruction by taking refuge in Scotland, where they hid a fabulous treasure beneath Rosslyn Chapel, as seen in *The Da Vinci Code*. The treasure and the Templar tradition, were eventually passed down to the founders of Freemasonry as the story goes. In fact, there was Templar treasure, Nicholson said, but it ended up in other hands long ago. “The most likely reason the Templars were dissolved is that the king wanted their money. The King of France was bankrupt and the Templars had lots of ready cash.”

FREEMASON MYTH No. 4

Washington, D.C.’s Streets Form Giant Masonic Symbols! It’s long been suggested that powerful Freemasons embedded Masonic symbols in the Washington, D.C., street plan designed mainly by Frenchman Pierre L’Enfant in 1791. The *Lost Symbol* is expected to prominently feature “Masonic mapping,” detecting pentagrams and other symbols by connecting the dots among landmarks. Pre-release clues released by author Dan Brown, for example, include GPS coordinates for Washington landmarks. “Individually, Masons had a role in building the White House, in building and designing Washington, D.C.,” said Mark Tabbert, director of collections at the George Washington Masonic Memorial in Alexandria, Virginia. “And small scale Masonic symbols can be found throughout the city, as they can in most U.S. cities.” But there’s no Masonic message in the city’s street plan, Tabbert said. For starters, Pierre L’Enfant wasn’t a Mason. And, Tabbert asked, why would Masons go to the trouble of laying out a street grid to match their symbols? “There has to be a reason for doing such a thing,” said Tabbert, himself a Mason. “Dan Brown will find one, because he writes fiction. But there isn’t one.”
