




Night out with the ladies at Michael D's was a real success. The Staff was excellent and the food was great. Thank you Worshipful Brother Larry Haines for setting it up!







The Cowan and the Eavesdropper!

These two words are heard at the opening and closing of every Masonic Lodge and are well known by all Brethren; but what is a Cowan or an Eavesdropper; and where did that term come from? Let's start with an Eavesdropper. The term comes from eaves dripping. Buildings with no gutters at roof level drip and leave an indented line on the ground where the water hits. It is believed that the Eavesdropper stood inside that ground mark close enough to the building to hear conversation inside. In older lodges the Junior and Senior Deacons would probe with their staffs into the darker parts of the beamed rafters to rout out hidden Eavesdroppers. Henry VIII had figures carved into the beams of the palace to remind his subjects that all conversations between them, either pro or con, would always get back to the ear of the king. Now the Cowan is known as a lazy uninstructed stone mason belonging to no Masonic Lodge and posing as a Mason having no knowledge of a real Masonic Craftsman. He is described as a stupid man who would pile field stone on top of each other without the use of motor. Today he would be known as a "scab" or non-union worker. Usually Cowan's were Eavesdroppers and were scorned. If known, they were not employed as Fellow Craftsman and not allowed near the building sight unless, in a necessity and than, at menial jobs. These terms are believed to be Scottish in nature. It is also interesting to note, regarding motor, that King Solomon's Temple was constructed without the use of motor. "The parts fitted with such exactness that it appeared as if the handy work of the Supreme Architect of the Universe rather that of human hands."
