



I hope this letter finds everyone in good health and in good cheer since better weather is finally here! I am sure that everyone else is was just as tired of the weather as I was! Unfortunately, this past winter, and the rains of the last month, have taken its toll on our roof. We have been fighting roof leaks over the past couple months, as some of you may be aware of, if you have taken a walk up to 2M into the Scottish Rite Candidates room. The ice from this past winter has caused the roof to develop a leak where the Verizon communication cables come down through. We actually lease our roof space to T-Mobile for their local antennae array. This makes them responsible for some items pertaining to our roof. It is a slow process with them, but I am working with T-Mobile to get this resolved as the CMA believes it is their responsibility to make any repairs as it pertains anything regarding their equipment. They have been cooperative thus far. Stay tuned on that one!

The other leak that we have is in the main hallway at the top of the main staircase on 2M. The foam roof has started to leak causing plaster damage and paint peeling. I had a proper survey of the roof done, and it is still savable if we do some maintenance on it NOW. Fortunately, our forefathers installed a high quality foam roofing system making repairs on it affordable if we act now. We have secured a contract with WM Roofing to make all necessary repairs and a recoat of the foam done to the entire roof structure. This will take place sometime in June at a cost of just over \$45,000.00.

In addition, we have plaster and paint damage in the Blue Lodge Candidates room and staircase, caused by old plumbing that is leaking in the ceiling above, which feeds the restroom on the Cathedral Room Level. Like I said in previous letter, our grand old lady is approaching 100 years and age is starting to take its toll at a fast rate. It is easy for us to come in and out of the building on a weekly basis without much thought of how she is maintained, or where the money comes from to do it. We have a small group of guys who are diligent in helping with maintenance but more help is needed and is always appreciated. If you have a skill in building maintenance and can donate some time, we would be forever grateful and can definitely find something for you to do. If you lack building maintenance skills, a big thing you can help with is supporting our Save the Temple functions as they arise. The Board is always looking for any ideas for fundraisers. We are going to try to hold benefits on a regular basic since the problems keep coming on a regular basis. Our first fundraiser will be a Golf outing on Saturday, June 11 with registration starting at 8 a.m. This will be held at the Spring Valley Golf Course in East Sparta, OH. 

the good act, not for himself, but for the cause of good!

If you, my Brethren meet such a man, you will see the personification of brotherly love, relief and truth; and you will have found the **ideal of a Freemason.**



Can the Grand Master Make Freemasons at Sight? Landmark Eighth Explained and Clarified!

The question regarding can the Grand Master make a Mason at Sight cane to light at refreshments several evenings ago. Most present were of the opinion since he is the Grand Master, he has the right to confer the degrees on sight. Well it took a little digging but I think we have a definitive answer to that question as outlined in the attached article found on the internet among many others published by many authors and Grand Jurisdictions of Masonry.

THE PREROGATIVE: OF THE GRAND MASTER TO MAKE FREEMASONS AT SIGHT, is a Landmark which is closely connected with the preceding, one. There has been much misapprehension in relation to this Landmark, which misapprehension has sometimes led to a denial of its existence in jurisdictions where the Grand Master was perhaps at the very time substantially exercising the prerogative, without the slightest remark or opposition. It is not to be supposed that the Grand Master can retire with a profane into a private room, and there, without assistance, confer the degrees of Freemasonry upon him. No such prerogative exists, and yet many believe that this is the so much talked of right of "making Masons at sight."

The real mode and the only mode of exercising the prerogative is this: The Grand Master summons to his assistance not less than six other Freemasons, convenes a Lodge, and without any previous probation, but on sight of the candidate, confers the degrees upon him, after which he dissolves the Lodge, and dismisses the brethren. Lodges thus convened for special purposes are called "Occasional Lodges." This is the only way in which any Grand Master within the records of the Institution has ever been known to "make a Mason at sight." The prerogative is dependent upon that of grant-ing Dispensations to open and hold Lodges. If the Grand Master has the power of granting to any other Mason the privilege of presiding over Lodges working by his Dispensation, he may assume this privilege of presiding to himself; and as no one can deny his right to revoke his Dispensation granted to a number of brethren at a distance, and to dissolve the Lodge at his pleasure, it will scarcely be contended that he may not revoke his Dispensation for a Lodge over which he himself has been presiding, within a day, and dissolve the Lodge as soon as the business for which he had assembled it is accomplished. The making of

Freemasons at sight is only the conferring of the degrees by the Grand Master, at once, in an Occasional Lodge, constituted by his dispensing power for the purpose, and over which he presides in person.

Reading through this directive as written; it occurs that if the Grand Master convenes an Occasional or Special Lodge, for the purpose of making a Mason or Masons at Sight; he himself or his representative(s) confers the work. He must have at least six other Masons with him in this, Occasional Lodge as witness. He has the right to than revoke his self made dispensation and dissolve or close this lodge at his will.

Now, this has all the trappings of the Grand Master's "One Day Class" as we know it and which all have taken part in. This example may not be exactly what can happen but it is probably a very close example of the given power of your Grand Master.
