


We're on our way to great year of Masonry and it's also time to get the lawn mower out (lol.)

Sir Knights I apologize. I was not able to attend our April Meeting but I look forward to being back in May.



The Origin of Mother's Day

Mother's Day is a special day for millions of people in the United States. Not only is it one of the largest greeting card holidays of the year, but it is also a time when families often get together to share their love of the mothers among them. At the very least, most mothers and women who are mother figures to others, are given phone calls, emails, and visits of appreciation. Presents and taking the mothers in question out for a meal are also common customs on this sweet day. But how did Mother's Day get started? Did your ancestors celebrate it? This is the story about Mother's Day.

St. Andrew's Methodist Church in Grafton, West Virginia

The first American Mother's Day was in 1908. It was celebrated when a woman named Anna Jarvis put on a memorial for her mother at St. Andrew's Methodist Church in Grafton, West Virginia. This church is now the location of the International Mother's Day Museum. Jarvis actually began to campaign to make Mother's Day a recognized United States Holiday three years earlier in 1905, when her mother died. Jarvis's mother, Ann Reeves Jarvis, who tended wounded soldiers on both sides during the Civil War, made no distinction between Confederate or Union in her care or compassion. She also started the first Mother's Day Work Club, which soon had branches in many states in the nation, to encourage the government and local communities to address issues of public health importance. Her daughter wanted to found a Mother's Day Holiday not only to honor her own mother but to honor all mothers, as well as to continue the charity work her mother started. Jarvis often said mothers were the people who did more for their children than anyone in the world.

Though the United States Congress rejected Jarvis's Mother's Day proposal in 1908, Jarvis did not give up working to make her dream of a day to honor all mothers a reality. The only reason Congress cited for rejecting the first Mother's Day proposal was that they would have to declare a Mother-in-Law's Day, too. The statement was made half-jokingly but was used to dismiss Jarvis's proposal. Jarvis continued to lobby Congress and work to gain public support for a national Mother's Day Holiday. Instead of going through Congress, she went to the states. By 1911, every state in the nation observed Mother's Day, with the first state being Jarvis's home state of West Virginia. Noticing that the states were doing what the nation was not, President Woodrow

Wilson declared Mother's Day as a national holiday in 1914, to be held the second Sunday in May each year as a day to honor all mothers and mother figures in the country.



Möbius and Masonry

Inspired by comments made by, Wor. Bro. W. Mike Lawson and a Grand Lodge Education Program.

My Brother, let us hold an imaginary strip of paper in front of us, say about two inches wide and 11 inches long. It has several elements recognized by mans view point. One side facing us, one side we cannot see, two edges and two ends. Agreed? Disregard its weight for now. Now let us move the two ends together and hold them together with finger and thumb. Now we have created a new shape, a cylinder with an inside and an outside. It has two edges but no longer two ends. Agreed? We have created a new object from an old one. Now, let us go further with this test of our imagination. Hold that strip of paper and twist one end one half turn and than place the two ends together with finger and thumb. What shape do we now have? Examine the number of elements present contained in this new shape. It has no ends like the cylinder but now it only has one side the side we can see and only one edge. The inside and outside are now the same.. Agreed? This object may be termed and seen as "stepping out of the box." This object is not new to man. This shape is called a "Möbius Strip," named after the 19th century German mathematician August Möbius who, along with Johan Listing, discovered its qualities 1858. Its unique characteristics are that all information printed on this strip of paper is available for viewing at all times without flipping the position of the strip of paper. If this object were suspended between rotating rollers, you need only print or record on one side to utilize the whole paper strip. Is that not "cool?" This method of connecting ends is utilized by the American Amish in their farm work. Connecting large leather belts together in this manner eliminates the wear on one side of the belt because, it only has one side, so wearing shiny, which may cause slipping over the crowned pulleys, does not accrue as soon on the farm implements. They also leave the belt drag over the ground to help keep it clean.

Now let's parallel this "Möbius Strip" to Masonry. Masonry always uses symbols to teach their lessons and as we know it in our normal lives, a man in society has two sides, the side he present to us and the one hidden – the other

side. This other side is where many problems arise when dealing with these, so called "clever people." You have heard the token phrase "never let your right hand know what your left hand is doing." Why? Is it doing something shady that you are ashamed of or you would rather not
