I believe summer is over and our kids and grandkids are headed back to school and university.



Please submit by 5:00 p.m. on Friday, September 9, 2022 to be considered for the position.

The Manager will report to the Canton Masonic Temple Association President with a direct interface to the Building Committee Chair.

Responsibilities may include but are not limited to:

Supervise the Temple Custodian

Receive and follow up on phone calls and emails received by the Temple

Monitor the Temple voice mail and advise responsible parties as appropriate

Distribute mail and packages to resident mailboxes/offices

Coordinate the scheduling of Temple events with the CMA secretary who maintains the official Temple calendar

Inventory and replenish, as needed, the various consumable supplies of the Temple

Ensure that all spaces and restrooms are cleaned and stocked before and after all functions

Coordinate with the Building Committee Chair on any maintenance items that need attention

Handle any small maintenance items, within one's abilities, that may arise

Work with the Building Committee Chair on any contractor scheduling that may need to take place for maintenance of the building

Set up, arrange and take down tables and chairs as required to meet the needs of specific events within the Temple

Maintain the Flag at the front of the Temple ensuring the adherence of proper flag protocol

Other assignments as determined to be appropriate for the position

Applicants must have some general mechanical knowledge as well as general computer knowledge. The ability to send and receive emails is mandatory. The ability to text via "smart phone" is a plus.

The work schedule is flexible, as long as the needs of the Temple are being satisfactorily met, but would typically be 8:00 a.m. until 1:00 p.m. – five days per week. This is a salaried position, dependent on the qualifications and experience of the applicant but because of the financial constraints of the Temple, the CMA board is hopeful of being in the \$1250.00 to \$1500.00 per month range.

Progressive Masonry - by William R. Fischer


Free Masonry is undoubtedly a progressive science. The fundamental principles of the institution are the same now as they were at the very beginning. Our principles should never change.


